

Her personal experiences, coupled with years of research, gives her the ability to connect with a wide variety of audiences from youth to adults, non-experts to professionals. Sabrina has been featured in various media outlets throughout Washington state over the years and founded the non-profit organization FailSafe for Life to serve her community. She is a Licensed Mental Health Counselor, certified as a QPR Master Trainer, ASIST trainer, and is a member of Prevent Suicide Spokane Coalition. Sabrina holds a B.S. in Public Health from the University of Washington and holds her M.A. in Social and Behavioral Health from Whitworth University.

MELODY YOUKER

Melody Youker is the community outreach and volunteer manager for Martin Hall Juvenile Detention Center. Melody has applied her passion and education in serving justice-involved youth for over 22 years. Focused on the need for prevention and intervention programs to route youth away from the criminal justice system, she also serves as a leader on several committees including the Inland Northwest Human Trafficking Task Force, the West Plains Safety Alliance. Continuum of Care Youth Committee, and is a consultant on Student Threat Assessment for school districts across Northeastern Washington. Most notably, Melody has been at the forefront of suicide prevention awareness as a member of the Prevent Suicide Spokane Coalition for over 20 years and currently serves as the committee chair. She is a certified ASIST trainer and part of the Crisis Response Improvement Strategy Committee. Melody received her B.A. in sociology with an emphasis in criminal justice from Montana State University.
